

Michigan PFAS Action Response Team Updates

Grayling residents on PFAS investigation

The Army National Guard and the Michigan PFAS Action Response Team (MPART) will update Grayling residents on the continuing investigation of PFAS contamination in private drinking water wells near Camp Grayling (Lake Margrethe and MATES at Range 30) and the Grayling Army Airfield on April 26, 2021.

Representatives from the Army National Guard, the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) along with District Health Department #10 will host the virtual community meeting on **April 26, 2021 at 6 pm**.

The meeting is planned as an online event, rather than an in-person meeting, to comply with current state measures designed to slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
